



Part IV. Entry Guidelines

Before Departure

Step 1. Register for K-ETA

K-ETA allows a visa-free entry for short-term travelers to Korea.

Click to Apply ▶ https://www.k-eta.go.kr/portal/apply/index.do

- * Be aware of fake agency sites and always make sure to use the official website.
- * Travelers must obtain a K-ETA approval before boarding the flight or ship bound for Korea.
- * If your country is not listed on the site above, please issue a visa.

Step 2. Q-Code: Quarantine Information Pre-Entry System Register your information on the Q-Code System and receive a QR-Code. It will shorten the time for your quarantine inspection upon arrival.

- * It allows to input information from 3 days prior to your arrival in Korea.
- * Travelers must complete the issuance of the QR code before boarding the flight.

■ Emergency Information

During the Program

The Korea Foundation staff will accompany you throughout the entire schedule while you are participating in the program. If you feel sick or are injured, please inform any one of them so they can expeditiously help you.

When you are sick or injured

Cold, allergy, diarrhea, indigestion, painkillers, and other non-prescription medications are available at pharmacies and some convenient stores. If you go to the hospital, it is necessary to wear a mask in accordance with the Health Care Act in Korea.

Insurance

The Korea Foundation has purchased travel insurance for all participants during the program. The plan includes coverage for some medical expenses and emergency travel services. The insurance plan covers the period from your arrival to departure (excluding the flight hours).

Buckle up!

Whenever you ride in a car, wear your seat belt at all times. A properly worn seatbelt will reduce the risk of injury and protect you in case of an accident.

■ Preventing Sexual Harassment

Definition of Sexual Harassment

Any unwanted comment or action of a sexual nature which makes others feel uncomfortable, regardless of whether or not it is directed at the recipient. It includes acts and behavior that cause humiliation in any form.

What can be considered Sexual Harassment?

- Physical Conduct (ex. touching and any other bodily contacts)
- Verbal Conduct (ex. repeated requests for dates at night)
- Visual Conduct (ex. displaying sexually suggestive objects, pictures, or posters)

What to do if

- ► As a Victim
- Confront the person and let him/her know that you were offended and need to be stopped.
- Keep records. Write down the dates, times, places, and find witnesses. If you have received any notes or mails from the harasser, keep them.
- Do not hesitate to contact the officer in charge of the program or someone you feel you can trust if the harasser persists with the behavior despite your complaint, or if you feel worried or threatened at any point in time.

► As a Witness

- Contact the program officer or the interpreters.
- Keep records. Write down the dates, times, places, and names of others who witnessed the harassment.
- The Korea Foundation will take it seriously. We will investigate the allegation and take prompt, effective action to correct the problem.

Currency/Credit Cards

The currency in korea is the won(W). Credit card usage is be very high in Korea, and international credit cards can easily be used in Seoul and other major cities. Some small shops and restaurants may only accept cash.

Bank/Currency Exchange

Cash can be withdrawn at a bank or ATM. Most convenience stores have ATMs installed, so international check cards can be used 24 hours a day. Money can be exchanged at banks, airports, hotels, downtown private currency exchanges (fee may vary), etc. Banks at major tourist destinations such as Myeong-dong and Itaewon in Seoul have "Global ATMs" where money can be exchanged 24 hours a day.



Voltage

The standard voltage in Korea is 220V/60hz. Voltage converter/adapters can be purchased at convenience stores or electronics stores.
